Reconciliation walk: Great to see so many families at the Reconciliation Walk. It was a beautiful community day with children, families and Djiringanj elders.

EDUCATIONAL PROGRAM

Sharing your child's learning: End of term USBs document your child's interests and learning. A reminder

of our preschool policy that NO photos are shared on social media please. In response to parent feedback, we now email the weekly program, so you have more regular feedback about your child's day and the educational program. Great for families who are unable to do drop off and pickup.

Cultural Program: _Aunty Ellen Mundy and Emma Stewart were here this term to share the Sea Animal Cultural Program with the 2-day group. They will be back next term to share this program with the 3-day group . Ellen and Emma provide our preschool with resources and knowledge which supports the use of Djiringanj language which benefits our whole preschool community.

We have also updated our acknowledgment with feedback from Savannahs' family, Ellen and Emma.

"We are Tathra preschool. Know the Djiringanj people where the first people to care for this country. We promise to look after it. The animals, the water, and the people too. Hello Boogan (earth). Hello Mirreewa (sky). Hello Niiagarn (me). Hello Moodgee (friends).





Children develop strategies to support personal afety: This term as we practiced our emergency procedures "Hold my hand" was a focus for practice. Children can read the signs at the front gate, so they know preschool.

Growing Project: Children set up the veggie garden beds by improving the soil with our compost from the tumblers and worm farm. Like every good scientist we hypothesise, observe, measure and document our findings. Children use rulers to measure and a graph to chart the growth. The tools of measurement and documentation provide children with hands on mathematical learning and science of growing our own veggies.

Literacy: This term we have had fun rhyming with lots of stories, rhymes and poems. Hearing and using rhyme, rhythm and repetition helps children develop early literacy skills.

Maths is everywhere: Playing games with dice and spinners; measuring plant growth and rainfall; counting to 10 and beyond; counting back from 10; creating sums, recognising and writing numerals and organising patients in the hospital with a numbering system are all part of our preschool day.

PARENTING RESOURCES

Parenting Workshop Tamara Keogh (Senior Occupational Therapist Royal Far West) provided tools and resources which support children's ability to regulate. Resources from the night were emailed and hard copies have been available.

Resilient Kids Toolkit - Royal Far West has some great resources and tools for families and children to strengthen mental health and build resilience.

- To complete design for DA approved bathroom extension and upgrade (Working party : Jane Courtney, Annette Turer/Imogen Fry and Kristen Boland). Hoping to have an interior plan by end of term 3.
- To replace climbing tree for future generations of children. We are thinking Ficus Hillier and welcome feedback. Choice of tree has a very narrow venn diagram (strong lateral branches for climbing/fast growing/evergreen/shade canopy for summer/minimises mess created by fruit/berries which attract bats etc). We welcome ideas.
- \blacktriangleright To replace perimeter fence.
- > To continue advocacy for increased educator wages.
- > To include a Reconciliation Action Plan page on the preschool website.
- Compost living classroom program article in progress to promote our partnership with Tathra Primary school in our aim to divert organic waste from landfill and promote sustainable solutions for managing organic waste.
- To use the Department of Education newly released Self-Assessment and Quality Improvement Planning Portal in the lead up to assessment and rating accreditation.
